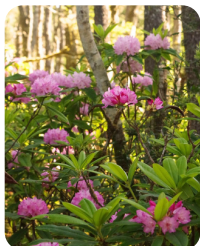


Cape Perpetua Forest Finds



Pacific Rhododendron

Pink/white flower clusters
5 lobes per flower
Oblong leathery leaves



Western Hemlock

Short, flat needles
Branches droop
Tiny cones <1inch



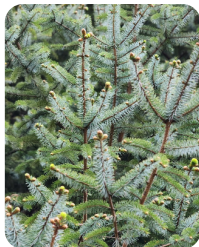
Salal

Evergreen shrub with
Pink bells in the
Spring and dark
berries all summer



Douglas Fir

Most common tree in
OR! Soft pliable
needles, branches
swoop upwards
3 pronged cones



Sitka Spruce

Only found on the
PNW coast!
Light colored thin
scaled cones
Very sharp very
pointy needles



**Western Lily of
the Valley**

Heart shaped leaves
Small white flowers
followed by brown to
red berries in the
Winter



Ghost Pipe

Lacking chlorophyll
Mycotrophic wildflower
Rare, do not disturb



**Coastal Fern
Varieties**

Sword, Lady, Deer,
Bracken, Oak,
Licorice, Maidenhair
